

## Vocabulary: Break and Enter Investigation

<b>Chromatography</b>	A scientific method used to separate and analyze chemicals in a liquid.
<b>Coroner</b>	A person who investigates a violent, sudden, or suspicious death in order to determine the cause and manner of death.
<b>Curator</b>	A person responsible for taking care of a museum's collection of objects.
<b>Evidence</b>	Anything that can prove that something, like a crime, happened.
<b>Fibre</b>	The smallest unit of a textile material. They can be woven or spun together to form fabric.
<b>Forensic Science</b>	The forms of science used to investigate crime by examining evidence (fingerprints, shoe prints, hair and fibres etc).
<b>Janitor</b>	A person who cleans and maintains a building.
<b>Pathologist</b>	A medical doctor who examines a body to find the cause of death.
<b>Suspect</b>	A person thought to be guilty of a crime.
<b>Witness</b>	A person who saw something or someone related to a crime.
